PROCEDURES FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF A WATERWAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

- 1. Letter of Interest submitted by seventy-five percent (75%) of the property owners indicating District boundaries.
- 2. Letter of Interest is forwarded to the Department of Natural Resources, by St. Mary's County, requesting the preparation of a Need and Feasibility Report and approval of the project.
- 3. The Department of Natural Resources prepares a Need and Feasibility Report with their recommendation and submits to St. Mary's County.
- 4. Potential dredge material placement (DMP) sites should be identified by the community.
- 5. A Public Informational Meeting is scheduled and estimated costs presented to the property owners.
- 6. A Petition must then be submitted by seventy-five percent (75%) of the benefiting property owners, which includes the identification of properties, district boundary map, estimated costs and the chosen method of assessment. The Petition must be approved by County staff.
- 7. County staff performs an evaluation concerning the value of the benefit from a project on benefiting properties versus the costs of the project to determine that the property receives a benefit substantially equal to or greater than the assessment.
- 8. A Public Hearing is held with the County Commissioners to establish the District by ordinance.
- 9. Preliminary designs developed, DMP site secured, permit applications submitted to the State.
- 10. Waterway Improvement Fund Grant Application submitted to DNR with preliminary design.
- 11. DNR project priority established, funding requested for Legislative approval. Larger projects may require multi-year funding.
- 12. Full project funding must be approved in the County budget.
- 13. County designs (in-house or by bid contract) the project; prepares the plans and specifications.
- 14. The project is advertised and bid for construction.
- 15. A Public Informational Meeting is scheduled and probable costs presented to the property owners. If bid proposals for construction and design costs <u>exceed</u> the amount identified in the Ordinance establishing the District, then a Public Hearing must be held to amend the budget of the District.
- 16. The construction contract is then approved and awarded.
- 17. After construction is complete, the County executes Waterway Improvement Fund (reimbursable) Loan Agreement with DNR and requests loan reimbursement from the Fund.
- 18. A Public Hearing is held by St. Mary's County to fix the assessment (Levy Ordinance).
- 19. The Board of County Commissioners shall fix and levy the benefit charges upon each lot in the District. The benefit charge shall be paid annually as County taxes.
- 20. Future maintenance of the project is the responsibility of the District.
