- A. Recruitment of New Trustee Members

- B. Division Budget for New Fiscal Year
 - The capital budget hearing passed without change to the Museum's request
 - The county budget is on hold until the state and federal budget amounts are clearer

4. OLD BUSINESS

- A. St. Clement's Island Museum New Building & New Water Taxi Update
 - The new building is out to bid; interested contractors (about three or four) have visited the site. The bid process will close soon.
 - Demolition will begin after the Jazz Festival.
 - Plans for what can go to Piney Point are in place and the mural is scheduled to be moved.
 - The exhibit money may have been put back into the CIP budget recently, having been taken out for a time.
 - Looking to bring in the museum design team ASAP. A script is nearly complete for the origin story, with the Piscataway working on their part.
 - In discussion with the Commissioners about what will happen with the water taxi for now—whether it will go to Piney Point or not. It will run during building construction.
 - The new water taxi is scheduled for July of 2025.
- B. St. Mary's County Museum Division & Friends of St. Clement's Island & Piney Point Museums Updates
 - The Friends are planning a party for current members.
 - The Friends will be the last people in the building before it closes and the first again once it reopens.
 - They got a \$10,000 grant from Maryland Humanities Council for upkeep and a \$4,000 from Maryland 250 for hosting the upcoming Rebels and Redcoats event.
 - In January, Second Saturday program was held at Piney Point Lighthouse Museum; Appraiser Fair at SCIM went well with 82 people participating; Division held safety training sessions for all staff
 - In February, the Annual Report was distributed; Community Day was held at SCIM and Piney Point where local postcards were brought in for scanning; Division was featured on WBAL TV with story and site visit at Drayden African American Schoolhouse; Held first Stuffed Animal Sleepover at Piney Point; Grant was received from MD 250th in support of Rebels & Redcoats; Staff attended the Small Museum Association Conference as sponsor/exhibitors and participants; Pre-bid meeting with contractors held at SCIM

C. St. Mary's County Department of Recreation & Parks Update

- Ray is learning about the various division in the department more, having toured the museums.
- The parks are in good shape.
- Looking to extend the Three Notch Trail by two segments.

- Looking to replace two-decade old software with a new system, preparing to go through a vendor selection process.
- The critical area request for Snow Hill Park has been approved by the commissioners; sightlines in the area will be improved.
- Questions: will state or federal budget have any effect on the Recs and Park Budget? Short answer: no direct effects expected now.
- The Point Lookout State Park will go to a reservation system for entrance during summer weekends, with no admission without a reservation. It may cut down on the number of visitors who formerly came and then might go to another park.
