This concept would provide a structure of ownership and control to give farmers and rural business a voice in the market and its success. New Library Comments

The following citizens addressed the issue of the location for the proposed new County library. Each provided their reason for the location. Examples of reasons for choosing downtown Leonardtown site included five acres donated for building site with utilities and fiber optics already in-place would help stimulate the economy of downtown and keep the tradition of small towns having Libraries in town. Examples of reasons for the Leonard's Grant area included close to school, property already owned by County and in the original concept plan for the property, visible location, room for large parking area, and within walking distance to two major housing developments.

It was suggested that the St. Mary's County Director of Economic Development work with Leonardtown to help boost the economy in Leonardtown and the County. It was suggested that some type of sports facility or a park could be put on the Tudor Hall property. Kathleen Reif, St. Mary's County Library Director

Thanked Commissioners for funding the new Library and reassured citizens that no matter where the library is built staff will make it like the others in the County – the best.

James Raley, P. O. Box 52, Avenue, MD 20609, President St. Mary's County Farm Bureau. Noted that the Farm Bureau endorses the process the Southern Maryland Agricultural Development Commission is recommending for the Agricultural Business Park and Food Innovation Center; however we are not supporting it yet because it is in the early stages -- a work in progress. The St. Mary's Farm Bureau can support two of the five items they are recommending -- meat and farmers market. We are not sure the other three are the best use of the money. The Farm Bureau believes there is a need to have a survey of the Southern Maryland farming community to determine their needs and ascertain what resources are required to increase on-farm profitability and direct public policy and resources to improve the success of our farmers. They have forwarded a letter to Dr. Chris Seubert, requesting the University of Maryland Extension undertake a survey of farmers in Southern Maryland similar to the one being conducted on Maryland's lower Eastern Shore. He provided the Commissioners with a copy of the letter and asked that the Commissioners endorse their letter in support of the survey.
