T*his annual report* is brought to you by the collective efforts of our staff and museum communities. Our museums and historic sites continue to flourish under the generosity of your financial and in-kind support. 2009 is notable for the completion of several sizable grants used to enhance exhibits, preserve historic structures and add recreational opportunities to our sites.

We hope that this report renders the accountability that our patrons have come to expect and a sense of pride in the accomplishments achieved through our county, community and private support.

Mission Statement

The St. Mary's County Museum Division was instituted by the St. Mary's County Board of Commissioners to collect, preserve, research and interpret the historic sites and artifacts that illustrate the natural and cultural histories of St. Clement's Island and the Potomac River, the Piney Point Lighthouse and the Chesapeake Bay, and the Drayden African American and Charlotte Hall schoolhouses.

With this as its charter, the Museum Division serves as a resource, liaison and community advocate for all St. Mary's County public and private cultural assets.

Overview of Facilities

The St. Mary's County Museum Division manages 94 acres of property and 4 historic sites, including: St. Clement's Island Museum and the Charlotte Hall Schoolhouse; the Piney Point Lighthouse, Museum and Historic Park; the Drayden African American Schoolhouse; and the U-1105 Underwater Submarine Shipwreck Preserve near Piney Point Park. The Museum Division also assists with the monitoring and maintenance of St. Clement's Island State Park.

Also in the Museum Division's care are:

- 6 historic buildings including the Piney Point Lighthouse; Piney Point Lighthouse Keeper's Quarters; the Piney Point Lighthouse Fuel Building; the 1943 U.S. Navy Workshop Building; the Drayden African American Schoolhouse; and the Charlotte Hall Schoolhouse
- 6 contemporary support buildings, 4 public piers, a kayak launch, an outreach van and a water taxi

2009 Exhibits and Exhibit Development

- "A Glimpse into the World of the Oyster Industry" exhibit designed and installed by museum staff at the St. Clement's Island Museum.
- Exhibit wall built behind the Potomac River Dory Boat "Doris C" on the grounds of the St. Clement's Island Museum.
- 24th annual Christmas Doll & Train Exhibit – St. Clement's Island Museum, temporary exhibit.
- Newly developed exhibit components were installed in the Potomac River Maritime Exhibit building at the Piney Point Lighthouse, Museum and Historic Park. Although listed here, this exhibit work was made possible with grants from the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority, the Board of County Commissioners for St. Mary's County, the Chesapeake Bay Running Club and the Friends of the St. Clement's Island and Point Museums.

 4. "Watermen and Their Life" exhibit centered around the Potomac River dory boat "Shamrock," research and design was completed and sent to the Marketech Company for fabrication.
 5. Exterior building signage installed on the Potomac River Maritime Exhibit building.
 6. Work began on the reproduction of bugeye boat ribs and frame work for the "Working Boats of Yesteryear" exhibit.
 7. Manikins depicting watermen/women/children were installed throughout the exhibits to enhance the visitor's experience.
- A "Political Memorabilia Exhibit" was presented at Piney Point in celebration of the 2009 Presidential Inauguration and the history of U.S. Presidents vacationing at Piney Point.
- "I'll Be Home for Christmas Exhibit" was developed and presented at Piney Point to help illustrate Christmas customs typical of light keepers stationed at the Piney Point Lighthouse.

- Hand-crafted models of the U-1105 Black Panther German Submarine were donated by David Howe and Gene Tallarico for exhibit purposes at the Piney Point Lighthouse Museum.

2009 Restoration/Preservation Work Completed

- Little Red Schoolhouse on the grounds of the St. Clement’s Island Museum, building and windows painted and doors repaired.
- Pest control maintenance performed on wooden historic structures within the Museum Division.
- Stabilization continues on the paint façade of the Piney Point Lighthouse Tower and Keeper’s Quarters.
- Piney Point Lighthouse shoreline revetment project completed.
- New handi-plank siding installed on the west gable of the Piney Point Lighthouse Museum.
- Potomac River Dory Boat “Shamrock” in the Potomac River Maritime Exhibit building completely repainted.

2009 Capital Improvements and Grant Projects Completed

- An orientation area was built in the Potomac River Room at the St. Clement’s Island Museum. Through generous donations, the room was equipped with a 60” plasma TV, DVD player and sound system, additional lighting, outlets and dimmer switch. Hand-crafted wood benches were purchased for our guests to enjoy the newly developed 13 minute film on the history of St. Clement’s Island and building of the Blackistone Lighthouse replica.

- Piney Point Lighthouse Keeper’s Quarters new metal roof and guttering installed, paid for in part with grant funds from the Maryland Historic Trust (MHT).
- Back porch and stairs rebuilt on the Piney Point Lighthouse Keeper’s Quarters. Paid for in part with funding from MHT.
- Removed and relocated entire electrical and telephone systems at the Piney Point Lighthouse historic site to make way for new grounds enhancements.
- The decrepid pier located on Piney Point Creek was removed. Payment for removal was in part with funds from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources Waterways Program.
- The Piney Point Creek Kayak Launch , fence, and interpretive panels fabricated and installed. Paid for in part with funds from the National Park Service, Chesapeake Bay Gateway Network.
- The Friends of St. Clement’s Island and Piney Point Lighthouse Museums were awarded a \$150,000 grant from the Board of County Commissioners for St. Mary’s County to build a collections management facility on the grounds of the St. Clement’s Island Museum.

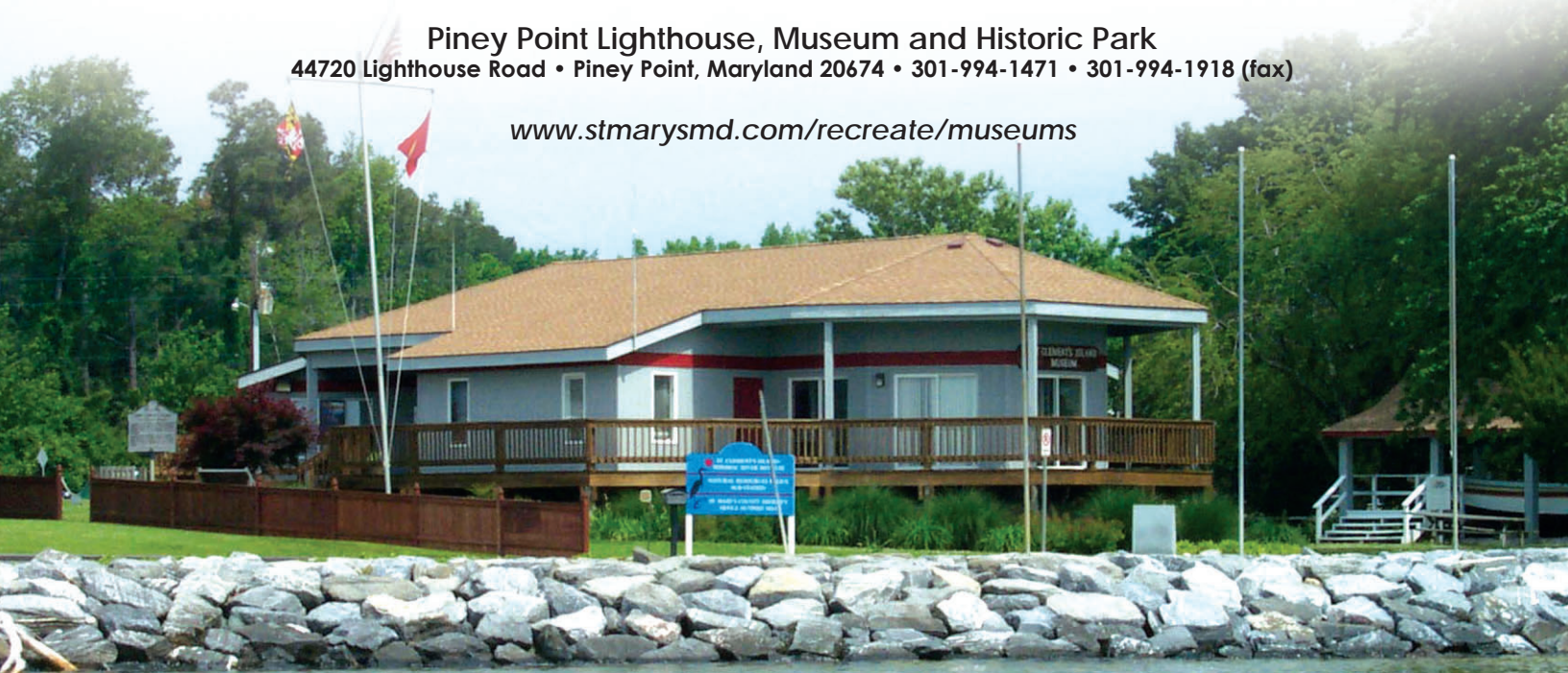
