#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Commissioners agreed to meet in Executive Session in order to discuss a matter of possible litigation. The Session was held from 9:20 to 9:50 a.m.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

#### ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT PROGRAM

The referenced individuals appeared before the Commissioners to explain the Advanced Life Support Program and to request the Commissioners support in a grant to be submitted to the Department of Health and Human Services. The Maryland Cardiac Rescue Technical Program Standards were presented and reviewed and Mrs. Hewitt explained that the EMS Council was desirous of having a vehicle stationed at the hospital for cardiac care throughout the County. She stated that it would be based on a similar program in Charles County.

After discussion concerning training, operation and function concerning the Advanced Life Support Program, the Commissioners indicated their support for the concept of the Program and requested that the EMS Council return with the Grant Application for their review and consideration.

#### COMMUNICATIONS IMPROVEMENT

As a follow up to previous discussion concerning the correction of communication transmittal and receiving problems, the referenced individuals appeared before the Commissioners to present a proposal by General Electric and to seek the Commissioners authorization for expenditure of funds for these improvements.

Mr. Cooper explained that General Electric proposed three alternatives to deal with the communications problem in certain areas of the County. He stated that after looking at the three possibilities, it was determined that a two-station system would give the greatest amount of coverage and would give more benefit to the operation of a communications system in the County. The present tower stationed at Banneker School would remain and an additional tower would be placed at the Bay District Fire Department in Lexington Park.

After discussion the Commissioners gave their concurrence for the expenditure of approximately \$13,000 for the improvements to the communications sytem, \$4500 of which has previously been budgeted and for the Budged Officer to determine the source of the remaining funds.

#### LEASE FOR DISTRICT COURT OFFICE SPACE

Present: Paul Raley, Director, Purchasing and Logistics

Mr. Raley appeared before the Commissioners as a follow up to previous discussion concerning negotiations with the State for the rental fee for office space for District Court at the Courthouse. He explained the developments concerning the negotiations and the fact that the State was not agreeable to increasing the rental fee.

Commissioner Millison agreed to negotiate on behalf of the County with the state officials. Mr. Raley was requested to arrange a suitable meeting place and time.

#### BEACHVILLE ROAD RECREATIONAL AREA

- R-81-13 posting Kirksted Court, Southwell Lane, Whiskey Creek Road in Sotterly Manor at 25 miles per hour from their intersection with Vista Road for the entire length;
- R-81-14 designating the following streets in Sotterly Manor Subdivision as Stop Streets:
  - 1. Kirksted Court as it intersects with Vista Road;
  - 2. Southwell Lane as it intersects with Vista Road;
  - 3. Whiskey Creek Road as it intersects with Vista Road;

R-81-15 - posting the roads in Section III of Spring Valley Subdivision at 25 miles per hour;

R-81-16 - posting all streets and roads within Beverly Estates Subdivision, Fourth Election District; namely, Dogwood Lane, Dogwood Court, Beverly Drive, Fowler Court;

- 4. Fowler Court as it intersects with Beverly Drive;
- Beverly Drive as it intersects with Mechanicsville-Chaptico Road.

#### REVISED CONSOLIDATED GRANT AGREEMENT GENERAL LOCAL HEALTH SERVICES AND GRANT PROGRAMS
