#### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m.

(Commissioners Loffler and Lancaster were not present at beginning of meeting.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Thompson moved seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve the minutes of the Commissioners' meeting of Tuesday, January 22, 1991. Motion carried.

#### APPROVAL OF BILLS

Commissioner Bailey moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the Check Register as presented. Motion carried.

#### COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S ITEMS

# 1) APPOINTMENT PLANNING COMMISSION

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to appoint Joseph E. Gardner to the Planning Commission for a term to expire December 31, 1995. Motion carried.

## 2) INFORMATION RELEASE 1990 CENSUS

The County Administrator presented an Information Release advising that the U. S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census has released the 1990 census for St. Mary's County showing a population of 75,974, a 27% increase over 1980.

The Commissioners agreed to distribute the Information Release as presented.

# 3) CORRESPONDENCE TO GOVERNOR SCHAEFER ST. MARY'S CITY COMMISSION

The County Administrator presented correspondence addressed to Governor Schaefer stating that after reflecting on the various proposals the Commissioners support the proposal of Delegate John Slade to establish a strong and independent St. Mary's City Commission.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to sign and forward the correspondence. Motion carried.

### 4) CRIMINAL JUSTICE MEETING

The County Administrator presented correspondence addressed to participants in the quarterly Criminal Justice meetings advising that because of the progress being made, a meeting subsequent to the January 22 would not be necessary. As the Pre-trial Supervision and Home Detention Programs develop, the need for a future meeting will be considered.

The Commissioners agreed to sign and forward the letter.

#### 5) BUDGET AMENDMENTS

The County Administrator presented the following Budget Amendments recommended for approval by the Director of Finance with justifications as indicated:

Justification: Burial assistance provided by Social Services

Justification: Additional fuel costs for non-public school transportation.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to approve and authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the Budget Amendments as presented. Motion carried.

# 6) ALLIANCE POLICY COUNCIL "WAR ON DRUGS'

The County Administrator presented correspondence addressed to community leaders inviting them to attend the next Alliance Policy Council meeting on Tuesday, February 26 from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. at the Carter State Office Building for an up-to-date report on the Council's efforts on the "War on Drugs."

The Commissioners agreed to sign and forward the letter as presented. Motion carried.

(Commissioner Loffler entered the meeting.)

# 7) SOFTBALL HALL OF FAME AGREEMENT

As a follow up to the January 8 presentation by Director of Recreation and Parks Baggett, the County Administrator presented an Agreement between the Board of County Commissioners and St. Mary's County Softball Hall of Fame, Inc. wherein the County leases to the Hall of Fame the first floor of a building to be constructed at the St. Mary's Regional Park. Mr. Cox pointed out that the only revisions to the Agreement are in paragraphs two and three concerning concessions.

Commissioner Bailey moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to approve and authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the Agreement as presented. Motion carried.

(Commissioner Lancaster entered the meeting - 9:25 a.m.)

### 8) COMPREHENSIVE WATER AND SEWER PLAN AMENDMENTS

The Commissioners having conducted public hearings and held subsequent decision discussion, the County Administrator presented the following Water and Sewer Plan Amendments for the Commissioners' review and approval:

Application to amend W/S Plan for property located in Fifth Election District, containing 168.3 acres, zoned RPD/RCA (Part), located on the south side of Oaks Cooksey Swamp Road, approximately 2.7 miles east of Md. Rt. 5, Tax Map 2, Block 15, Parcel 32, from W-6 to W-3.

Resolution No. W/S 91-02 Charlotte Hall Business Park SPEC #89-1911

Application to amend W/S Plan for property located in Fifth Election District, containing 36 acres, zoned C, Commercial, located on the south side of Golden Beach Road, approximately 150 feet east of Md. Rt. 5, known as Charlotte Hall Business Park, Tax Map 1, Block 22, Parcel 42, from W-6 to W-3.

Commissioner Bailey moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the referenced Water and Sewer Amendment Resolutions. Motion carried.

# 9) SHERIFF'S OFFICE BASE RADIO STATION AGREEMENT

The County Administrator presented an Agreement between the Sheriff's Office and the Bay District Volunteer Fire Department for the provision of space and reimbursement of electricity for the Sheriff's Office base radio station transmitter, receiver, antenna and tower, which is located on the premises of the Bay District Volunteer Fire Department.

Commissioner Thompson moved, seconded by Commissioner Bailey, to authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the Agreement as presented. Motion carried.

# 10) RESOLUTION NO. 91-01 DISPLAY OF AMERICAN FLAG

The County Administrator presented the referenced Resolution encouraging all citizens to display the American flag on a daily basis to demonstrate support for those serving in the Armed Forces in the Persian Gulf.

Commissioner Bailey moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to approve and sign the Resolution as presented. Motion carried.

## MARYLAND'S MOST BEAUTIFUL PARENT PROGRAM

Present: Dr. William Marek, Health Officer

Dr. Marek appeared before the Commissioners to explain the referenced Maryland's Most Beautiful Parent Program and to request the Commissioners' support of this project. Dr. Marek advised the Commissioners that in 1987 the Governor instituted "Maryland's Most Beautiful" Program and Maryland's Most Beautiful Parent is an offshoot of that program. The program is designed to recognize and celebrate

outstanding role models for parents or any adult responsible for the care of children in Maryland. Dr. Marek indicated that he, as have the other health officers in the State, has been asked to serve as the coordinator for St. Mary's County.

In conclusion Dr. Marek requested the Commissioners support of this project and their participation particularly at the end for the awards ceremony. No county funds are being requested.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to endorse the Maryland's Most Beautiful Parent Program. Motion carried.

### PINE HILL RUN SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT

Mr. Petty appeared before the Commissioners to advise that the capacity of the Pine Hill Sewage Treatment Plant will be at capacity in about two years, and that plans to upgrade the plant should begin now. Mr. Petty advised that the plant was constructed to handle 4.5 million gallons per day, and it is currently using 2.9 MGD. Mr. Petty stated that the Metropolitan Commission is concerned about considering this major capital expense when revenues to support this expense may not be there. Customers pay the debt service for improvements; however, since this expansion is for future growth, new customers have not been identified.

Mr. Petty stated that the Metropolitan Commission's original plan was to add 1.5 MGD of capacity; however, the State has indicated that the at the time of the next major expansion additional facilities to lessen environmental impact of the effluent, particularly nutrient removal will be required. He stated that because of the recession and because of the uncertainty of revenues, the Metropolitan Commission is proposing a smaller incremental expansion and hopefully delaying the requirement for nutrient removal until a full major upgrade is done. Mr. Petty advised that a consultant was hired to do a scheme for the expansion, and the Metropolitan Commission has selected the recommendation to do preaeration at a cost of \$750,000. He stated this would give the plant capacity another two to three years growth.

In closing Mr. Petty stated that he would keep the Commissioners advised on this project and whether the State will accept the modifications as presented.

# OFFICE ON AGING REVISED ADULT DAY CARE BUDGET

Present: Gene Carter, Director, Office on Aging

Mr. Carter appeared before the Commissioners to present the revised budget for the Adult Day Care Program through the current fiscal year and stated that this is a requirement by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. Mr. Carter distributed handouts show original estimates, current revenue and expenditures, funding sources and attendance records. Mr. Carter pointed out that the health of the Program will be dependent on the number of medical assistance participants in the program.

After discussion Commissioner Lancaster moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the revised budget for submission to the State. Motion carried.

# OFFICE OF PLANNING AND ZONING ZONE 390-1216 - CEDAR COVE - AICUZ

Mr. Densford reviewed a site plan with the Commissioners, showing the AICUZ line by using a dashed line rather than a solid line and showing a notation that it is subject to the terms and conditions of a development agreement between the County and the Property Owner back to the early 1980's.

# 1) SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT INGLESIDE SUBDIVISION

Mr. Ichniowski distributed the handout for the Public Informational Meeting for road improvements in Ingleside Subdivision near Smith's Nursery Road. There are seven property owners that would be assessed at \$461 per year for twenty years.

After discussion Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Lancaster, to authorize Mr. Ichniowski to proceed with the taxing district process. Motion carried.

### 2) CORRESPONDENCE TO ST. MARY'S COLLEGE FISHER ROAD

Mr. Ichniowski presented correspondence to Dr. Lewis, President, St. Mary's College regarding the College's plans for construction of a new loop road which requires modification to county-owned Fisher Road. The letter states that it is the County's position that Fisher Road should be turned over to St. Mary's College, and that it would be necessary for the County to go through a formal abandonment process.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Lancaster, to sign and forward the letter as presented. Motion carried.
