Commissioner Randall suggested the ALS requirements were not clearly understood in the past and that the process should be improved in the next budget review cycle.

(\$100,000) *and to reduce Lexington Park Library project budget

Item 3.e. was not approved at this meeting. The Library project came in at approximately \$48,000 under the original scope of the budget which is commendable. However, the Board of Trustees feels the non-functioning coffee bar needs to be addressed. Commissioner Randall recommended Mr. Rohrbaugh review the schematics and work with the Board of Trustees to fully address this issue and return to the Board on November 19, 2002.

 Department of Planning and Zoning (Teresa Wilson, Historic Preservation Planner; Jeff Jackman, Senior Planner)
 Approve and sign the Certified Local Government Certification Agreement (SMC approved for participation as a CLG in national historic preservation program)

Commissioner Anderson congratulated Mr. Jarboe on his leadership in making SMC's transit service the top service in the state for 2000 and 2002. Ridership has tripled in the last three years.

(Amendment would allow an agent of the buyer to sign a statement on behalf of
the buyer that buyer intends to use property for owner-occupied residential use.)

Commissioner Anderson moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to approve the County Attorney's office to schedule a public hearing to amend Article XV, Chapter 267 of the Code of Public Laws relating to Real Property Transfer Tax. Motion carried.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to amend the agenda to add the Leonardtown Wharf Easement agreement. Motion carried.

The County uses a few hundred square feet of the Wharf as an easement. Releasing the easement would benefit the property owner (St. Mary's Ice and Fuel) and the town of Leonardtown.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to approve the scheduling of a public hearing on the release of St. Mary's Ice and Fuel from the easement agreement with the County. Motion carried.

RECREATION AND PARKS: BMX TRACK STATUS

The sites investigated included property near the airport and the landfill. Due to multiple factors, the sites were not ideal. The ultimate long term goal is to include a BMX track as part of the public park system. An early solution would be to use the capped landfill site for a short term "bridge" until a permanent site can be identified in a public park. Unfortunately, this location is within 3 miles of the airport and FAA/MAA restrictions may apply.

The Commissioners recommended the BMX group meet with the Recreation and Parks Board and the Fairgrounds Board looking at including a track site within an existing park facility or at the fairgrounds. Because the track is a public/private partnership whose purpose is ultimately to improve recreation and tourism, the track should be located in a practical locale. George Erichsen will contact the FAA, MAA to obtain a ruling on the 3 mile limitation on spectator sports near airports.

- Participated in a dedication for new program space at The Center for Life Enrichment. SMC unemployment is down to 2.7%, however, the developmentally disabled unemployment rate is astronomical. One of the goals of the workforce development program is to remedy this problem.
