Dear St. Mary's County Board of Health:

Background & Introduction

The St. Mary's County Health Department (SMCHD) provides numerous services to the residents of our County in order to promote an environment that optimizes population health and safety. Our Environmental Health services are primarily utilized by food service facilities, homeowners, and local businesses including contractors. Fees corresponding to these services are very modest and significantly lower overall than those of our surrounding counties. The current environmental health fee schedule falls far short of the actual cost of services, as confirmed by a desk audit conducted by our agency in 2013.

St. Mary's County Health Department seeks a slight increase in service fees in order to better offset the actual cost of service and implement specific customer service initiatives designed to improve efficiency and transparency benefitting our Environmental Health clients. The proposed fee schedule still does not cover the actual cost of services rendered; the changes would be very minimal from the current schedule. The proposed fee increases range from \$7/service to \$38/service with the average fee increase of \$18/service. The projected increase to the Department's annual budget is estimated between \$30,000 and \$35,000.

The Environmental Health fee schedule was last updated in 2007. At that time, the County Board of Health had recommended reviewing the fee schedule every two years. The recurring review was not implemented, however, with the arrival of the nation's recession. Now, eight years later, we are proposing another small adjustment to the fee schedule that is based on an inflationary model (similar to the model supporting the 2007 increase). The proposed implementation date requested is October 1, 2015.

Demand for environmental health services has bounded upward since the last Environmental Health fee schedule increase in 2007. This is despite a significant reduction (11%) in environmental health staffing since that time. The St. Mary's County population has increased by 13% while the demand on our environmental health services has increased by 49% since 2007.

We feel the proposed slight change in fees is well worth the potential benefit to our clients and county. For examples, transitioning records fully to electronic format would improve quick access to data for both staff and the public – leading to enhanced workforce efficiency and increased transparency as we work towards providing our public with direct access to nonmedical records. Funds would also be utilized to improve industry communications with both public and private sectors.

Summary

Proposed SMCHD environmental health fee schedule changes: average of \$18/service fee increase (range \$7/service - \$38/service). Based on an inflationary model. New fee schedule still far less than the actual cost of service. Proposed implementation October 1, 2015.

Fee change will contribute to initiatives designed to improve workforce efficiency, make records available electronically to the public, and improve communications with clients and partners.

Prior Board of Health direction

Last approval of an Environmental Health fee schedule change in 2007, based on inflationary model. At that time, the Board of Health recommended a review of the Environmental Health fee schedule every two years.

Proposed Timeline

July 28, 2015 – Board of Health to consider motion to move to public hearing on new SMCHD Environmental Health fee schedule

August 2015 - Public hearing on proposed environmental health fee schedule changes

September 2015 – Report to Board of Health on outcomes of public hearing with motion to approve recommended environmental health fee schedule

October 1, 2015 - Implementation of new SMCHD Environmental Health fee schedule

The current fee schedule and the minor changes proposed reflect our agency's desire to keep fees low in order to minimize the burden on residents and businesses utilizing environmental health services. We feel the benefits allowed by the proposed increases would be of tremendous value to our residents and local businesses.


