



FAQS: INTERNET SERVICE

1 Does St. Mary's County Government (SMCG) have regulatory authority over local internet service providers?

- No. The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regulates internet services. For more information or resources, visit [fcc.gov](https://www.fcc.gov).
- SMCG does have "Cable Franchise Agreements" which allow companies to use the public right-of-way to provide cable television services in the county. These agreements **do not** address other services that the provider may offer, such as internet or phone.

2 Is there a "monopoly" on internet service in St. Mary's County?

- No. The current franchise agreements in place between St. Mary's County Government and local cable/internet providers are **not exclusive** ("monopolies").
- Currently, SMCG has agreements in place with Breezeline and ComCast. There is no restriction in our [Cable Ordinance](#) or either of these agreements which would limit service areas or prevent expansion of areas served.

3 Can we get other internet service providers in St. Mary's County?

- St. Mary's County Government would welcome additional internet service providers to our community - And because our franchise agreements are **not exclusive**, other cable companies can invest in our community.
- Any Internet Service Provider that is willing to offer services in St. Mary's County is able to and encouraged to do so.

4 What is St. Mary's County Government doing to address internet connectivity?

- Through various grants, SMCG works to improve and expand the local broadband infrastructure to ensure options for affordable, ultra-high capacity, high-speed broadband and expanded cable offerings are available in the county.
- SMCG is actively working with multiple internet services providers to improve high-speed internet access to addresses in St. Mary's County.
