Minutes of preceding regular meeting and special meeting Aug, 3, 1943 read and approved.

Mr. H. G. Mueller, Chief Supervisor of assessments, State Tax Commission worked out with the Board the division of the County into five assessment Districts for the purpose of putting into effect the continuous assessment law on January, 1, 1944. The Districts to be as follows:

1st Assess. District to comprise the present 1st & 9th Districts

Judge Wm. M. Loker appeared before the Board and advised that it have the Attorney to the Board study and pass on the sufficiency of the Treasurers bond before it was approved by the Court. The Board instructed its Attorney to do this.

Miss L. M. Dent, Mr. P. J. Bailey and Mr. Jas. Baldwin appeared before the Board in reference to the County's application to the F. W. A. for new school buildings. The F. W. A. having put forward a counter proposal for a new high school building at Great Mills on the Basis of the County raising \$30,000.00 from the sale of Bonds and F. W. A. making a grant of \$105,000.00 to put up a \$135,000.00 building. In the absence of its attorney the Board took no action on this proposal.

The Board agreed to guarantee to Mr. Jas. Baldwin, Architect the actual Engineering costs, but not in any event to exceed \$1250.00, of preparing plans for a high school building at Great Mills, in the event that he was not retained as Architect for the building.

Mr. Chas. J. Mattingly, Health Inspector, asked the Board to take some action to require the approval of the Health Dept, of the premises and facilities of all applicants for licenses for Bars, Restaurants, Dance and Recreation Halls, before a license may be issued for any such establishment. The Board agreed to do this providing its Attorney found that it had the necessary legal authority to act.

Father Gipprich appeared before the Board and said the various schools not receiving State aid were willing to continue the transportation of children to these schools on the same basis as last year with the County dividing not less than \$25,000.00 between the various schools, to be apportioned among them on the basis of milage covered by the busses of each school. This arrangment to continue for at least one year and the Director of each school and one Responsible Citizen to contract with the County to transport these children to and from the various schools and to give bond for the faithful performance of contract. Father Gipprich said a new bus would be needed at Chaptico also one at St Josephs colored school and one at Little Flower school and a very small one at St. John's.
