

January 3, 1950

Board held the first meeting of 1950, with two members present, Messrs. J. Frank Bailey and Frank Bailey. Capt. M.R. Bailey is ill. He returned home from Baltimore Jan 4th, very much improved.

Roads.

Mr. Jim Combs reported bad condition of roads- Old Indian Bridge Rd. Mr. Thompson was present and informed Mr. Combs he will start work on that road as soon as the Cedar Lane and St. Andrews Rds are completed- within a few days if the weather holds good.

Old Horse Landing, Laurel Grove. 3 families use this road and same drains right at the entrance of the owners' road which makes it almost impossible to get over after a heavy rain. Mr. Thompson was present and will take care of this matter.

Alms House

John Morris and family still at Alms House, sheriff notified to put them out at once. Copy of letter was sent to Mr. Ford at the Alms House, that this family is to be removed at once, since Morris is perfectly capable of taking care of his family.

Mr. Frank Bailey and secretary visited Alms House and inspected the heating plant now being installed by Smith's Inc. Work is progressing rapidly.

Inquired into the mentality of Janie Barnes who disturbs inmates by loud talking and singing at night, has spells and smashes things (Mr. Frank Bailey saw her room after one of these spells and it was a perfect wreck.) Mrs. Ford, curts wife, is afraid of Janie and asks that she be examined by Dr. Greenwell, alms house physician and sent away for the safety of those living in the house.

Transportation

Mrs. Essie Owens on the Lesienne Rd., asks that her 2 children attending St. John's be picked up by bus coming in 1 mi from road to do so. Says bus route is changed due to new road. Contacted Mr. Frank Bailey and he advised Mrs. Owens that Bd. agreed to have this done. Alex Webb's bus contract will be increased 4 mi per day and necessary change will be made in his contract.

LeRoy Thompson advised the Bd. he has been driving 4 mi per day since 2nd week of school term- 72 days in 1949, 28 mi @ 20¢ \$57.60 due on this for 1949 - in 1950 his contract will have to be increased \$92.00, 116 days @ 4 mi @ 20

Mr. Black of the Enterprise Iron Works, Balto bid on screen mesh for jail. He visited the jail and will send bid for work.

Haye-Davis Co ask that we consider tags for dogs, etc from them and they were requested to advise price of same.

Mr. Sterling having called about the zoning laws in connection with locating the houses in Loc. 11, 1 for a physician's office the other day resolution was passed at length that same cannot be done- quoted Mr. Duiseco's opinion.

Report of strip of land in Fanny Point area referred to Planning Commission which will report back its findings later.

Spencer Br. Marsh, Bowden, Dor County presented tails of 2 dogs he had killed, untagged dogs. Tails were proof of destruction of dogs which were public nuisances. Paid \$2.50 for this work. He was advised that any dog or dogs caught in the act of destroying poultry or cattle- either tagged or untagged- can be killed. Also, that all dogs must be licensed and wear their tags. He was further advised that he should notify owners they must secure tags for dogs, allow a certain length of time for this to be done, and that after that time if they do not comply with law, dogs may be killed. Mr. Duiseco read from Pub. Section 1st 16, Sec 230

Label Law- when the question of the status of the School Law came up Mr. Duiseco and Miss Dent advised that a telephone call to Balto had cleared the situation. Due to the fact that Balto and Montgo. Counties had already begun work on new schools, an Emergency Bill was passed granting them funds for the work and these counties were instructed to pay up their accounts for State Aid. This was done and the Emergency Fund allocated. State Bd. of Education informs that new application blanks are being prepared for the remaining counties to execute and send them in with accounts for participation in the School Aid Law. Since the original law had been declared invalid, this is not necessary for all counties to do.

Mr. Dent. Miss Dent informed the Bd. that blue prints for this school had been revised several times and the State Bd. of Educ. had had a conference with Mr. Baldwin and herself. The only change suggested was in the exterior which was referred to Mr. Bowie- who has the plans of the building in charge. It is hoped the new plans will be let in February or both Bd. of Education and Co. Tax are curious for the work to get us away.
