Regular Meeting

The County Commissioners met today, in regular meeting, and present were Mr. J. Frank Reley and Frank J. Bailey. Capt. M.R. Bailey, is at home, much improved but unable to attend meetings as yet.

Mrs. Alex Wilkinson ask that son Jimmie be sent to Spring Field to be cured of acute alcoholism. Certificates sent to Dr. F.F. Greenwell and F.A. Camalier to be filled out and sent with son.

Wm. M. Loker, Jr., appeared in re Zoning property owned by James C. Birch in Pinoy Pt. Petition asks that certain strip of land be zoned residential because residences now lie along that strip and balance of land in that area may later be requested zoned "agriculture". Planning Commission to consider matter at meeting tonight. Report ready for Mr. Loker Jan 24-

Atty. J.C.E. Sterling appeared with Mrs. Emma VanWert re-town disposal and garbage, refuse etc. Lot is swamped with rats, breeds flies, incinerator is not in working order and smoke blows thru her home when windows open. Has appealed to Town Commissioners who in turn have asked full time employee to take better care of things there. Health Dept condemned this dump 2 yrs ago but to date Town Commissioners have done nothing about it. Dr. Harris present at this meeting and says proper stack would carry smoke and odor away. Mr. Loker, present also, and Clerk to Town Commissioners advised that Health Dept had furnished plans for stack etc., and same were to be used in the very near future. Clerk was instructed to write a letter to the Town Commissioners, sending copy of same to the Health Dept., requesting that proper steps be taken to correct this nuisance, and to have stack erected at once.

Lights which have been installed on the Public Parking Lot adjacent to the Welfare Bldg are very inadequate. Clerk was instructed to communicate with the Sc. Md. Elec. Co-Op at Hughesville, asking that better lights be installed. The parking area is still dark.

Dr. Wm. Harris had a short conference with the Board. He advised that Dr. Allan D. Howser, 10 No. Melcher St., Johnston, N.Y., has been in St. Marks and looked the situation over and would like to accept the offer of the State Dept. of Health to come here as full

time Deputy Health Officer, but due to the fact that his position in New York pays him a better salary than that offered by Md., he cannot come without a supplemental salary. The Board has been paying Dr. Harris \$50.00 per month for his work here, and they agreed to increase that to \$100.00 for Dr. Houser if he will come for that additional payment monthly. Secretary was instructed to communicate with Dr. Houser, and send copy of letter to Dr. Harris.

Dr. H. is spoke of the Vision and Hearing Tests for school children. No arrangements are made by the State to care for the children in parochial schools who need treatment. Mr. Briscoe will ascertain whether or not the County Commissioners can make the necessary arrangements to take care of these children. Dr. Harris advised that a Technician would be needed for 3 weeks, the County would have to pay for her room and board, and she would receive the salary of a school teacher while here. A Specialist to administer treatment would cost \$50 per day, and he would be needed one and one half days yearly Feb-Mar and May (\$225.00). Board to be advised by Mr. Briscoe of the legality of the matter. (Otologist)

Secretary was instructed to communicate with Members of Genl. Assembly and ask that proper steps be taken to include the vote for or against the County Memorial Library in the next election in Nov 1950.

B. P. Thompson, who appeared last fall, came before the Board and requested that County maintain the road 1 1/2 mi on the Old St. Andrews Rd. Matter was referred to Mr. Thompson by letter. He is requested to give his report on the feasibility of the County assuming maintenance of the road.

DEED for Right of Way, W. Graves et al, road All Faith towards the Patuxent River filed for recording.

Owen Lathan, formerly working for Jos. Alvey, has been injured by auto accident and unable to work, aged 57, not eligible for Old Age pension; asks to be sent to County Alms House. Board agreed. Secretary will contact Welfare Bd and ascertain whereabouts of Lathan and have him removed to Alms House.

Board adjourned at 1 p.m. for lunch.

Re. from Moonlight Club thru to Wash. 1st state road attached drawing shows where road hook-up is desired and only necessary to put in large amount of gravel to make this hook-up in good condition. Matter referred to Mr. Thompson who was present.

Board adjourned at 2 p.m.
