#### Roads.

North Holan Farmerville, requests pipe at entrance to her road is under water after a rain, and a pipe at the entrance to same would help matters. Board agreed to request State Roads Com to place pipe where necessary

#### St. Mary's City.

Com. Edmund Messers, Grecks, Goddard, Lewis, requested the Board to again consider the road which goes below St. Mary's City thru the Gen. Talcomb property. Some opposition had been met previously from Gen. Talcomb when the matter was approved last year. All opposition has been removed. The delegation was advised they should secure deed to right of way, present same here and matter will be handled as soon as possible.

#### 7th Dist.

Letter from Mr. Robert E. Fogue was read, he was asked to have the group interested in this road to appear before the Board and the matter will be given attention.

#### Alms House.

Letter from the Sanitarian of the local Health Dept. was read. Thorough inspection of the Alms House shows it is in splendid sanitary condition. In a Jan of 1949 heat, light and water facilities have been installed. Bldg shows every indication of being kept clean. New beds and bedding has also been purchased for use of the inmates and old blankets cleaned. Isaac Ford, superintendent was reported as having whipped Janie Barnes. Dr. Greenwell reported the matter. Isaac Ford revealed that in a fit of temper Janie climbed out on the roof and he was unable to go out after and get the broom and fanned her with the broom. She came back into the house. He was instructed that under no circumstances should he ever attempt to whip any of the inmates. He agreed to not do so.

#### Zoning 2nd Dist

Request from Mr. James Burch for strip zoning in 2nd Dist. Planning Committee estimates cost of Zoning would be approx. \$5,000 area requested is Blake Creek to St. Geo. River along shore line Potomac Riv to Herring Creek - purpose to prevent encroachment of business in residential section Board advised no action would be taken until all property owners in this section request zoning.

#### Auditor's Report

Mr. A.S. Jump, CPA had interview with Bd. Spoke of lateness in sending out Tax Bills which are payable Jan 1st, and bear interest after July 1st. Impossible for him to complete either Treas or Assessor's books, since all Personal Property Schedules not in He advised Mr. Lawrence where Schedules not sent in on time, he should use that of last year as Jan 25th is dead line for those reports. Mr. Jump completed audit of County Commissioners' books and set up new system of Accounts, which is similar to that used throughout the state. County Budget for 1949 was on estimated basis and was set at \$262,791.86 but actual expenses were \$365,171.03 Large portion was for repairs to Court room, chairs, etc., water and light and extra rooms at Alms House. It will be necessary for the Bd to advance to the Treasurer the amount of \$102,182.00 to make deficit. County Budget for 1950 based on \$16,000,000.00 has been checked assessment value has been increased. Mr. Jump will complete the work on Budget when he comes in March at which time all schedules etc., should have been received and County taxes ascertained.

#### Gasparovic- 8th Dist Zoning

With further reference to the matter of rezoning Gasparovic's property in the 8th Elec Dist on GM road, for the purpose of erecting Bowling Alleys, etc., the Bd sees no reason to change its' original decision to rezone the property "C" commercial. Considering the Public Hearing held Jan 26th, full copy of testimony is in Gasparovic files, Bd. feels that business is rapidly moving up towards the NATC from Great Mills, and that within a short time

the entire main artery will be business and not residential. Mr. WM. Loker, Jr., atty for Mr. Gasparovic was so advised. Plans for Mr. Gasparovic's building, and survey made by Mr. Bowman are in possession of Mr. Nicolet.

Schools. Miss Dent came before the Bd. relative to her budget which has to be made in 2 sections, Sept to Dec at '49 rate and Jan to June at '50 rate, very confusing and much unnecessary work. Forms now ready to be prepared for the School Loan for 2 projects- 5th Elec Dist Elem and Bannaker, Miss Dent was asked to contact secretary to secure any information needed to complete forms

#### Town Commissioners Meeting.

Afternoon session was taken up by Town Commissioners- K.B.Duke, T.W.Bell R.B.Duke, and their atty W.M.Loker., relative to strip of land to be taken from side of Court House- west side- to make room for sidewalk to wharf, from Beacon Lane. 4 ft would be very narrow. Mr. Bailey and Mr. Briscoe looked at the section in question and said they felt it could be done. Mr. Thompson was requested, by letter, to have state roads engineer look over the land and report on safety of sidewalk, and necessity for having retaining wall. Mr. R.B.Duke mentioned that it had been the practice of landowners to pay for  $\frac{1}{2}$  cost of sidewalk construction but Bd. said they felt if they gave the land that was all they would do. Town Bd spoke of their summer program which includes sidewalk from Dr Greenwell's to Mattingly's lane where Norris property is taken from front of house, small plot at rear has been deed to J.R.Norris to offset any loss he might otherwise feel. Tudor Park Corp agress to deed R of W to Town for sidewalk, Bd. of Co.Com would have to deed R of W from Beacon Lane to jail lane.

Town Commissioners were on their way to see Bd of Education about new school for Leonardtown, since within a few years there will be 80 children of school age on Lawrence Ave alone.
