All members and their attorney were present at the regular meeting held today.

Hospital Group

A group of Lexington Park, represented by Dr. Wm. Patrick, Messrs. Gaylord Aschenbeck, Wm. Chapman, V. Dietz called with reference to the construction of a new hospital in that area. They were advised by the Board that there are no funds available for this project and letter was sent to Mr. Aschenbeck stating this. It appears from Bill 139 Sec 304 that if the County cannot erect such a building, Federal funds can be secured if the building is to be located in a Critical Defense area- which is that status of Lexington Park.

Mr. Doby- 4th District road to his farm impassible. Good at either end, but cannot get to tobacco barn. Mr. Guy and Mr. Thompson will see what- if anything- can be done about it and report at next meeting. They think the road is not a County road.

Jail- roof leaking

Alms House several repairs necessary- Mr. Nace Ford was requested to have patch in floor placed where the old heater was. Also hole in wall where someone fell downstairs needs patching. He will have this done and present bill to Board. Ceiling needs repairing where it has rusted through. He was requested to contact Winters Metal Co and see if they can fix the ceiling.

Letter to USArmy Engineers for permit to construct timber bulkheads to replace those washed away by erosion, at Tall Timbers.

Fuel oil contract given to So.Md. Oil Co-LaPlata for year at $\frac{1}{2}$ cent per gallon less than delivery price.

Bus route of Mr. John Bean checked by Mr. Stone. says bus is overcrowded but after talking with Mr. Bean Board finds he is not willing to put on an extra bus at the rate of 20¢ per mile, which is the regular rate. The Board suggested Mr. Bean buy a used bus for this. No definite action taken.

Elias Gant- overcrowded bus- he was advised to do the best he can until next season when proper allowance can be made for extra bus service.

R of W to Carroll Road recorded, and accepted by Board. SRC so advised

Dr. Houser requested 1951-2 Library appropriation and part of salary of X-ray technician to pay for repairs on audiometer. Granted.

Mrs. Miller requested road be repaired, she paid to have same surveyed and graded and reported that Mr. Hill said Mr. Thompson had advised him not to go in the road with the grader. Mrs. Miller wants to road in condition so she can take her child to school. Water from the VanWard farm overflows on the road. Mr. Guy thinks Mr. VanWard will give R of W to have this made a State or County road.

Letter from Southern Concrete about the Sutter Co not paying for footings at new Health Center Bldg. Mr. Sutter was advised of this in letter. Mr. Sutter was also requested to make an inspection at least once a month of this job, in order to expedite the work. Mr. Tily reports that work done so far is perfect, but slow.

R.B. Duke called to see about radios approved by Co. Commissioners for fire trucks. This is allowed in Civil Defense budget but radios not need.

Mr. Alvey consulted with Mr. Thompson about the old Stevens road which washes out after every rain. No action taken.

Alma House steps also need replacing. Should be crossotated wood.

G. F. Long, 4th Dist. called about road in "Middle Farm" in March 1946 Mr and Mrs Long and Mrs. Godcharles appeared relative to this road. No action taken. Mr. Long says the road needs graveling and he will furnish the gravel free 7/8 mi. Mr. Guy will report on this road at the next meeting.
