

December 11, 1951
Regular meeting.

This morning the Commissioners sat in Tax Review of new property for the entire County. All members, their attorney, Mr. George Lawrence, Supervisor of Assessments, Mr. W.B. Raley, Asst. Tax Assessor were in attendance. Ten complaints were heard but none were allowed.

Clerk was requested to write to Dr. Snell-6 D. that his assessment is the minimum for a brick dwelling- 40¢ cu ft. His neighbors have frame dwellings but none have been reduced as he had said. Letter also to be sent Mrs. Bertha Poe-her assessment is to stand as set.

Mr. W.S. Donaldson of Chaptico appeared about R of W through his farm. He is willing to give all the land necessary and Mr. Carpenter will grade the road if the SRC will put on the gravel which is to be given by Mr. Carpenter and Mr. Donaldson. The R of W is an old abandoned road, but when same is usable several lots will be sold for homes. Mr. Dobry has sold his place to Mr. Weaver and a Mr. Bradford has also purchased a home site. This road formerly hooked into the Red School and Tin Top roads Gardiner's Mill to Chaptico. Mr. Donaldson explained that 3 or 4 pipes will be needed to drain the water and Mr. Thompson says these can be had after the DEED is given to the Commissioners. Grading of road is to begin this week by Mr. Carpenter. No gravelling will be done this winter. The Board advised Mr. Donaldson they will accept the road after the proper procedure is followed.

Mr. Baldwin came in to congratulate the Commissioners on having Leonardtown declared in the defense area. Altho several telephone conversations have been had about this matter, no Directive has been received confirming these calls. Mr. Baldwin further said that when the Commissioners apply for funds, they must be very sure that the area they desire to assist is really a critical area, stating why.

A letter was addressed to the Attorney General relative to payment of salary of Trial Magistrate.

A short meeting of the Planning Commission was held and Mr. J. Claude Johnson of Morganza, Md., was appointed to succeed Mr. Dickey who had resigned, but whose term would be up in May. Letter has been written to Mr. Johnson asking that he accept the position.

Executive session was held relative to continuing the employment of Mr. Nicolet as Technical Advisor of the Planning Commission. His work is satisfactory and the Board feels in view of the increasing work necessary for the new housing project it will be well to make no changes at this time, and the appointment re-

Commissioners desire to have all records belonging to the Planning Commission in the Court House. These records are to be made available to the County Surveyor, attorneys etc but should be kept locked up. Mr. Thompson requested a letter from the Commissioners to this effect.

Personal Property Taxes not paid must be collected. Mr. Sterling interpreted the law to place the work of preparing the extra tax bills in the Treasurer's office. On the bottom of the bill the Treasurer must write an order to the Sheriff to make a levy and collect these taxes.

Letter to Mrs. Sophie Bowles, Loveville, Md., advising she is to continue transporting the Clarence Guy, Elmore Guy and Ruark children to the Academy for the rest of the School year which closes June 1952. Mrs. Bowles is to be paid \$30 a mo for this work. Letters to Mrs. Clarence Guy and Mrs. Elmore Guy advising that this service can continue for the rest of the school year but they will have to use the regular bus transportation beginning Sept. 1952.

Sam Thompson, Abell's Wharf requested bus to come in 3/4 mi to pick up 10 yr old child. Board says it cannot do this for 1 child.
