The Commissioners and their attorney met today in regular session.

Mr. G. Alex Hebb, parochial school bus contractor wants to add \$800.00 to his present contract, or divide the contract and let him keep the original one 75 mi per day for \$3,590 per yr. He will keep that and the other is to be advertised for two weeks, for new contractor.

John F. Dean's route to be advertised for 2 weeks, as his sons do not want it at the present amount which they feel is not at 20¢ per mile but at 15¢.

Mr. Gilbert Dorsey, Mech. RFD, asked that bus come in road 3 mi from State road to pick up his son. The colored parochial bus comes in 2 mi to pick up 2 small colored children. He was advised by letter that if he will bring his son and the two small colored children to the State Road the Commissioners will pay him \$288 per year. (*wants to be paid each month 24⁰⁰ Sept. Aug 54*)

In approved glass enclosed automobile bus, sufficiently large to give each child a seat, and always at a safe rate of speed.

Hutcherson, colored, California, requests Board build a road into his place of business. Mr. Thompson will see about this.

Dr. Houser reports that Evans, inmate of Alms House is dissatisfied there. He will contact Mrs. Rapp and see if she can place him in a family elsewhere.

The Board of County Commissioners left at 3 p.m. to meet with the Board of Education in Executive Session, regarding the school building program.

Executive Session.

The Board of County Commissioners and their attorney met with the Board of Education on Tuesday afternoon, concerning a request by the Board of Education that the County Commissioners make application to borrow the sum of \$406,000.00 for School Construction Purposes under the 1953 State School Bond Issue. The Commissioners desired detailed information as to what projects this amount would cover. They were advised by the Board of Education that they then had under consideration the following:-

- #1 Great Mills Elementary School, multi-purpose room
- #2 " " High " new wing, which would include gym and to abandon the frame building
- #3 Jarboesville School -colored- multi-purpose room and 2 class rooms
- #4 Hollywood School- 2 new class rooms
- #5 Elementary unit for colored children to be constructed in the upper part of the county, 4 classroom school

The Board of Education informed the Commissioners that they would look to Federal funds for the construction of G.M.H.S. and Jarboesville, and possibly Ridge School.

The schools in order of priority, to be improved or constructed out of County funds are as follows:-

It was then pointed out that maybe some of the momey available under the 1953 State School Bond issue could be used for the new Leonardtown school.

There was a request made by the Board of Education that an entrance be made into the Ridge School. The Commissioners said they would take this under advisement.

The County Commissioners took no action in making the application for the money available under the 1953 State School Bond issue but agreed to take the matter under advisement and render thier decision to the Board of Education at their next regular meeting on August 11th,1953

There was considerable general discussion between the Board of Education and the County Commissioners relative to the school situation in the County.

Meeting adjourned at 5:45 pm when the Commissioners returned to Miss Dent the application blanks for the loan.
