Commissioners and their attorney met in regular session this morning.

Two representatives of the Burroughs Adding Machine Co appeared to talk about a new machine for Billing and recording Taxes- machine costs \$6,000. They were requested to send in additional information on this machine.

Letter received from Chas. LaCaron who owns property along the Scotch Neck Road, he agreed to give 40 ft Right of Way if others there will do likewise. Mr. Bond will secure names of property owners here and contact them.

Bert Gray came in about an old abandoned County road which leads to his farm. He advised that lumber hauled from Mr. Barbarich's place had cut the road up- he was informed that he could place an obstruction across the road to prevent others from using it.

Sailor requested 12 new mattresses for jail. Clerk instructed to order them. On the 1st floor of the jail there are accommodations for
12 colored- 2 drunks- 1 insane, and special quarters for 4 women
2nd floor has accommodations for 12 men- 2 juvenile- 2 detentions.

Rev. James Wilkinson, SJ and Mr. George Dedderer, the latter representing the Naval Base at Patuxent River, came in about additional transportation to and from the Base to Little Flower school which will cost \$435.96 for the rest of the school year. Letter was addressed to the Commanding Officer of the base agreeing to this.

Mrs. Lillian Blackstone came in to ask for transportation for 2 children 1-14 yrs old 1-10 yrs old, $\frac{1}{4}$ mi Mr. Guy will contact Frank Ellis about this road.

At noon the newly elected Commissioners took oath of office
Leonard S. Alvey, Leonardtown, Md.
C. Byron Guy, Clements,
John M. Hodges, Valley Lee, Md.
Mr. Alvey was appointed President of the Board.

The afternoon was given to further consideration of the proposed Budget for 1959-60
Meeting set for Dec 12, 1:30 to sign the Budget and set Tax rate.
