Joe Sinclair came in regarding the purchase of the Parochial School bus contract from Ben Hill- He was advised that the contract is for 84 miles at \$3,250.80 per yr., \$270.90 per mo for 12 months. Any additional miles on this contract will be paid for at the rate of 20¢ per mile. He will advise if any additional mileage

Messrs Frank and Kenneth Duke came in about the taxes for Patuxent Section 1-2-3-4 Center Gardens, Lex. Pk. Md. Mr. Frank Duke was given a True Copy of the Resolution regarding 1958 taxes for the above- 1959 taxes will be abated.

County Commissioners desired a meeting with the State Fire Warden- there is no State Fire Warden- each County has its own supervisors and Mr. Rawlings will be contacted to meet with the Commissioners regarding the burning of public sanitary fills.

James Lacey, Sr janitor for Health Bldg was notified, 2nd time- that the building was in a very poor condition. Unless he improves and the building continues to be neatly kept, his services will not be required after Dec 31. Mr. John Hodges looked over the building and confirmed reports received from Health Dept and Bd. of Education.
