1. Call to Order

3. New Business

A. Event Logistics and Information

The HPC members plan to attend and table at the Oyster Festival, on Saturday, October 18, 2025 from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m., and Sunday, October 19, 2025 from 11 a.m. - 6 p.m. at the fairgrounds. Gabrielle Gleissner presented the members with the FY26 HPC Budget information and the quantities of branded merchandise that the Commission currently has. - Exhibition of Artifacts Ask for donations and potential loans of artifacts relating to Oystering and the Watermen lifestyle and culture to have on exhibition during the event.

The members concluded they would like to create a trifold that highlights the Commissions' mission, how people can join, and more general information about preservation overall. The members would also like a factsheet to be created about watermen lifestyle and culture. Gabrielle Gleissner advised she could begin to work on this and members can provide any specific information or pictures they would like to see.
